Judging

The judging of beer at the Dixie Cup is our forte. We draw a nationwide pool of judging talent. The judging panels are chock-full of BJCP Master and National judges and brewing professionals from across the country in addition to the legions of Certified and Recognized judges.

All judging takes place in open sessions. First round judging starts at 9 A.M. on Sunday, September 27, and continues at 6 PM on Tuesday September 29, 9 A.M. on Sunday, October 4 and 6 P.M. on Tuesday, October 6. All early judging is at Saint Arnold Brewing Company. Additional judging sessions, also at St. Arnold's, will be held at 9 A.M. on Sunday, October 11 and at 6 P.M. on Tuesday October 13 at St. Arnold's as required.

First round judging concludes at the hotel beginning at noon on Friday, October 16. The first round of judging will be used to eliminate obviously flawed beers and completely judge small categories.

We intend to judge all sub-category styles together during the first round. This is not always practical when multiple sub-categories within an overall category have a small number of entries. For this reason, small sub-categories may be combined in the first round, with each beer judged according to its own style guidelines.

Second round judging will begin at noon on Saturday, October 17, and will be used to determine ranking within each category. All sub-categories of each major category will be judged against each other, each according to its own style guidelines.

The final round consists of the first place winners from each category and is used to select the "Best of Show" awards.

Decisions of the judges are final. Winners will be announced at the awards ceremony Saturday evening.

We will be using the 2008 BJCP style guidelines and the BJCP 50 point score system. Complete style descriptions are available from the BJCP web site at www.bjcp.org.

We are making considerable efforts to secure the most experienced, qualified judges possible. We are soliciting qualified judges and stewards from all participating homebrew clubs. Judges who have passed the BJCP exam are especially welcome. Points will be awarded for the BJCP. The Dixie Cup is a BJCP and AHA sanctioned competition.

Once again, we are soliciting your help in having a successful Dixie Cup. If you are not in the BJCP, don't worry. We still need lots of folks to make this work—and this means you!

Special Style

This year, our specialty category is *Frankenbier*. Your brewing task is to take a classic German beer style and give it "American" parts to create a highly quaffable beer with both German and American characteristics.

First, choose one of the following classic German beer styles: Bock (5A, 5B, 5C, 5D), Dunkel (4B), Kölsch (6C),

Oktoberfest (3B), Rauchbier (22A), Roggenbier (15D), Schwarzbier (4C), or Weizen (15A, 15B, 15C). Then, choose at least **two (2)** of the following American parts to produce your Frankenbier: American yeast, American hops, American malt/wheat or other American grains, malt smoked with American wood, or conditioning the beer in/with American wood.

Your Frankenbier will be judged on how well it meets the BJCP guidelines for the German base beer (25 out of 50 points total) with the remaining 25 points awarded based on your creative/effective use of American parts to enhance the beer's appearance, aroma, flavor, and, most importantly, overall drinking pleasure.

Note: While medals will be awarded for this category, they do not count towards brewer or club points and do not qualify for Best-of-Show. Therefore, only two (2) bottles are required.

MCAB Qualifying Styles

The Dixie Cup is one of the final qualifying events for the Masters Championship of Amateur Brewing (MCAB) to be held in 2010. In order to maintain the Dixie Cup tradition of awarding more medals than the major BJCP categories, some of the MCAB qualifying styles are split across multiple medal categories. In these instances, the first-place winner in each split category will qualify for the MCAB championship finals.

Entry Requirements

The Dixie Cup competition is open to all non-commercial, home-produced beers, meads, and ciders. Beers, meads, and ciders produced on the premises of commercial breweries (including Brew-on-Premises) are not eligible. You may enter as many entries as you like, **but no more than two entries per medal category**. Please see the list of categories included in this information packet.

The entry fee is \$7 per entry until September 18 if you register your entries online, or \$8 per entry if you use the paper entry forms. Late entries will be accepted until September 25, but the entry fee will cost you \$10 per entry, with no discount for online entries. Get those entries in early, avoid the rush, and save some money. **Absolutely no entries will be accepted after September 25!** Please make checks payable to THE FOAM RANGERS.

Each entry shall consist of three, preferably but not limited to, 11–12 oz. bottles; 7 oz. bottles are permissible for strong ale and mead categories. All commercial and home-made labels must be removed.

A completed bottle label must be attached to each bottle with a rubber band—**no tape or glue**. Indicate the category abbreviation on the bottle label and include the beer name, especially if you have two entries in the same category.

You may either register online at www.foamrangers.com or complete a recipe form for each entry. Be sure to fill in

the *Pertinent Style Information* section, to provide necessary style information to the judges, for the following styles: rye beers entered in American Wheat or Rye Beer (6D), Belgian Specialty Ale (16E), Fruit Lambic (17F), Fruit Beer (20), Spice, Herb, or Vegetable Beer (21A), Specialty Beer (23), Other Fruit Melomel (25C), Metheglin (26A), Open Category Mead (26C), New England Cider (28A), Fruit Cider (28B), Other Specialty Cider/Perry (28D), Frankenbier (29), and First Time Entrant (30). This section is optional for all other categories.

Please fill out the recipe form as completely as possible. Not only will this help ensure that your beer is placed in the correct category, it will also enable us to give others a detailed listing of your award-winning brew. Winning recipes may be published in the much-maligned *Brewsletter Urquell*, the official brewsletter of the Foam Rangers. If you register online, we may ask you for a copy of your recipe.

Attach your check to a completed registration form and, if you are not registering online, your recipe sheet(s). If a team name is listed, all points for the Templeton award and Lone Star Circuit Homebrew Team of the Year will be credited to the team. No points or partial points will be awarded to the individual members of the team. If multiple homebrew clubs are listed, only the first one listed will receive points for the Dixie Cup trophy and the Lone Star Circuit Homebrew Club of the Year.

Any entry not meeting the above requirements will be disqualified. Disqualified entries may still be judged, but they will not be eligible for any awards.

Packing Entries

We suggest that you wrap each bottle in a section of bubble wrap or newspaper. Place one entry (three bottles) in a cardboard malt case or similar sized box, separate the bottles and fill the extra spaces with wadded newspaper or packing Styrofoam. Line a cardboard box with a plastic trash bag and place smaller boxes and plenty of packing material inside the bag. Make sure to fill the box completely! Tie the bag and seal the box securely. Mark the box **FRAGILE** and **THIS END UP**. These markings mean absolutely nothing to the shippers, but should give you some peace of mind anyway.

Shipping

We suggest UPS regular rate for the best price, or second day air if you are pushing the deadline. If asked about the contents, you might say, "Bottles, but they are well padded and double-boxed." Shipping via USPS is illegal, but if you decide to use them anyway, be aware that they do have a higher rate of broken bottles than UPS or the other parcel carriers. Regardless of the carrier, label the box *Kitchen Supplies*. Ship your entries to:

You may also drop your entries off in person at DeFalco's, or Brew It Yourself (25770 Interstate 45, in Spring; phone 281-367-2739).

Entries will be accepted beginning September 7. Enter as early as possible. Avoiding the last minute crunch will allow time for your beers to settle and make planning easier for the organizers. As a general rule, beers that arrive early tend to do better in competitions than last minute arrivals. Every little edge can help.

Awards

Individual medals will be awarded to the first, second, and third place winner of each category. The judges have sole responsibility for determining if all of the medals in a particular category should be awarded, or if there are ties for a particular medal.

First Time Entrant Award

This award is open to new entrants to the Dixie Cup and is offered as an encouragement to new brewers to "get their feet wet" in competition and get some quality feedback on their brewing efforts.

The BJCP category and subcategory must be designated for proper judging.

Note: While medals will be awarded for this category, it does not count towards brewer or club points and does not qualify for Best-of-Show. Therefore, only two (2) bottles are required.

Best of Show Awards

Best of Show for both Beer and Mead/Cider will be awarded from the judging of all of the first place winners of each category (except the First Time Entrant and *Frankenbier* categories).

Mike Templeton Award

This award, presented in memory of one of the original Foam Rangers, is given to the brewer who accumulates the most points at the Dixie Cup (3 points for first place, 2 points for second place, and 1 point for third place).

In the event of a tie, the brewer with the most first place awards is the winner. If this still results in a tie, the brewer with the highest Best-of-Show placement(s) will be declared the winner.

The Dixie Cup Trophy

Given for the most points garnered by a club, based on the same rules as the Templeton award.

Lone Star Circuit Homebrewer, Homebrew Team, and Homebrew Club of the Year

The Dixie Cup is the final contest of the Lone Star Circuit competitions where individuals, teams, and clubs can earn points towards becoming the Lone Star Circuit Homebrewer of the Year, Lone Star Circuit Homebrew Team of the Year, and Lone Star Circuit Homebrew Club of the Year. Points are awarded for placing in a participating contest (based on the same rules as the Templeton award).

T-Shirts

Commemorative Dixie Cup T-shirts will be available for purchase at the Dixie cup for \$13 (\$14 for XXL and larger) each. However, only orders received by September 25 will be guaranteed T-shirts. If you are not coming to the Dixie Cup and still want a T-shirt, you should either make arrangements for someone to pick up your shirt for you or add \$3 per shirt to cover postage.

An image of this year's T-shirt can be found on the registration form and on the Dixie Cup web site.

Partying With the Foam Rangers

If you want to take part in all the activities planned for this year's Dixie Cup, and you are not already a dues-paid member of the Foam Rangers, then be sure to get your temporary membership in the Foam Rangers for the low, low price of \$25.

Your temporary membership in the Foam Rangers entitles you to participate in the milli-conference, barleywine tasting, Fred tasting, and Friday night dinner and drink from the beer taps. You will also receive the post-Dixie Cup issue of the *Brewsletter Urquell*.

Welcome Reception

There will be a welcoming reception to kick off the Dixie Cup competition at the hotel on Thursday, October 15 at 7 P.M.

Friday Night Dinner and Other Food

There will be a dinner provided on Friday night after completion of first round judging. You must be registered with the Dixie Cup to get into the area serving food. We've procured the services of a bouncer, and we're not afraid to use him.

The hotel has a restaurant that is available for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. There are also a few restaurants within walking distance of the hotel.

Lunch will be provided to judges on Saturday afternoon to help you get through the judging.

Fred Tasting

This year's Fred Tasting will feature another great pairing of food and beer. Don't miss this Friday night tradition after the completion of first round judging and the dinner.

Barleywine Tasting

Start Saturday morning off in style with a toast, and taste the spirit of the Dixie Cup. Bring your favorite barleywine to the barleywine tasting at 8:30 A.M., prior to the milli-conference.

Milli-Conference

This year's milli-conference features Garrett Oliver (brewmaster of The Brooklyn Brewery) and Scott Metzger (founder and CEO of Freetail Brewing Company). The milli-conference will start at 9 A.M. on Saturday and will be followed by second round judging, with lunch provided for the judges.

Pub Crawl

After all the judging, and presentations from our esteemed guests, you need to get out and get some beer and food. Hop aboard the bus and tour some of Houston's finest beer establishments. The buses leave at 4:30 P.M. and return at 9 P.M., just in time for the raffle and awards ceremony. Pub Crawl tickets are \$25.

Hotel Information

We have reserved a block of rooms for the Dixie Cup that are available at the discounted rate of \$75 per night until 3 P.M. October 1 or when the block of rooms is sold out, whichever occurs first.

After October 1, rooms may be available, but there is no guarantee. The hotel has filled up for the past several years, leaving several people who waited until after the deadline without a room. Don't be left without a room, make your reservations early.

Call the hotel directly and mention *Dixie Cup* or *Foam Rangers* to get the discounted rate. Reservations made via the web site or national reservations number may not get you the best rates.

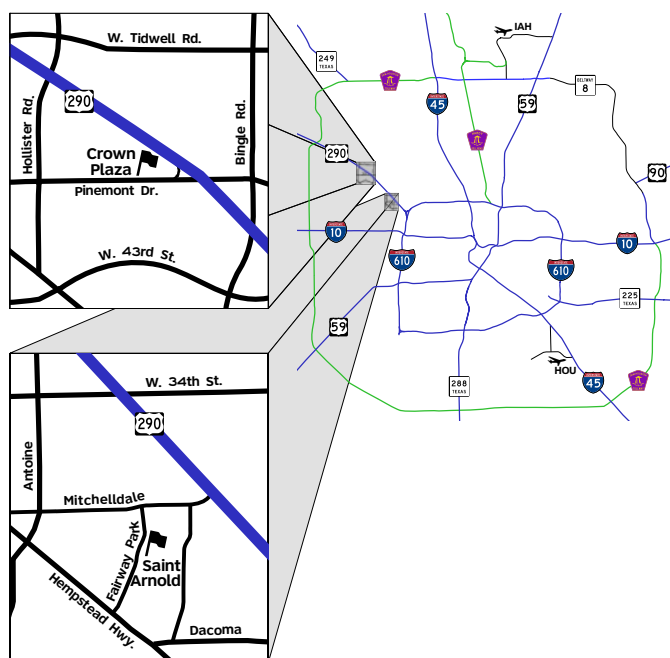
